



Flamingo side table

Inspired by the flamenco posture. The position that your body adopts in moments of relaxation is the key to creating the legs of this table. Its S-shaped structure supports a recycled coralite red marble top. The legs, made of reused MDF board, facilitate disassembly and transport in a flat box.

Kokeshi space divider

Based on Japanese lanterns, it combines a black metal structure with textured recycled plastic panels. They have horizontal grooves to simulate the texture of lanterns. It is adjustable, backlit and allows you to create compositions with several modules.

Fanus Lamp

Inspired by Arabic lanterns, it is a copper-plated geometric container with side windows, through which a soft light emanates through a cylindrical wooden screen. The combination of the triangle and the circle gives the lamp a charismatic geometric projection. Its structure is adaptable as a table or suspended lamp, allowing compositions with several units.

Ortiz Echagüe's work exalts tradition and identity through a visual language that borders on abstraction. His photography captures the essence of the landscape and humanism, using wool as a metaphor for collective memory and resistance.

In his images, wool vibrates like a living organism, reflecting the connection between man and his environment. An example of this tradition is the shepherd's cloak from Villaciervos, a centuries-old symbol of Iberian pastoral culture, made from Spanish merino wool and recognized for its functionality and minimalism.

Inspired by this dialogue between past and present, OTEYZA presents El Pastor, a piece that reinterprets the shepherd's cloak with wide cuts and noble materials, fusing tradition and contemporary design. Wool, the central element of the installation, becomes a symbol of identity and evolution.
